- 4. The team will begin to update the Manual of Operations.
- 5. A reminder that the next Presbytery meeting is on Thursday, May 18, beginning at 4:00. It will be held at Valley Community Presbyterian Church, Golden Valley. Dinner is planned. There will be a Zoom option.

### VI. Report of the Treasurer

Although we are still working through details of year-end 2022 financial details, we can report that the Presbytery ended the year 2022 with \$612,277 in total revenue (per capita, unified mission giving, and more) and \$640,783 in total expenses. This leaves the Presbytery with expenses over income of \$28,556 for the year.

It is important to note that expenses were greatly reduced because of staff transitions throughout the year (Executive Presbyter, Stated Clerk, and COM Coordinator). Also, that because the Presbytery is closed over the Christmas-New Year holidays, that \$57,662 in 2022 per capita revenue was received and booked in January 2023. (In other words, that income will be reported in 2023 results, although congregations are given credit for their 2022 per capita amounts due.)

## Part VII Redress of Imbalance

### **Book of Order G-3.0103 Participation and Representation**

The councils of the church shall give full expression to the rich diversity of the church's membership and shall provide for full participation and access to representation in decision-making and employment practices (F-1.0403). In fulfilling this commitment, councils shall give due consideration to both the gifts and requirements for ministry (G-2.0104) and the right of people in congregations and councils to elect their officers (F.3.0106).

Each council shall develop procedures and mechanisms for promoting and reviewing that body's implementation of the church's commitment to inclusiveness and representation. Councils above the session shall establish by their own rule committees on representation to fulfill the following functions: to advise the council regarding the implementation of principles of unity and diversity, to advocate for diversity in leadership, and to consult with the council on the employment of personnel, in accordance with the principles of unity and diversity in F-1.0403. A committee on representation should not be merged with another committee or made a subcommittee of another committee.

### **Book of Order G-3.0301 Composition and Responsibilities**

The presbytery is the council serving as a corporate expression of the church within a certain district and is composed of all the congregations and ministers of the Word and Sacrament within that district. The presbytery shall adopt and communicate to the sessions a plan for determining how many ruling elders each session should elect as commissioners to presbytery, take into

Stated Clerk Report to Presbytery 2023 Page 16 of 20

consideration the size of congregations as well as a method to fulfill the principles of participation and representation found in F-1.0403 and G-3.0103. Ruling elders elected as officers of the presbytery shall be enrolled as members during the period of their service. A presbytery may enroll, or may provide by its own rule for the enrollment of, ruling elders during terms of elected service to the presbytery or its congregations.

### **Current Policy for Redress of Imbalance**

At the Stated Meeting on November 13, 2018, the presbytery adopted the following:

### Redress of Imbalance

At the first regular stated meeting of the Presbytery after January 1 of each year, the Stated Clerk shall communicate to the Sessions and Presbytery the number of ruling elders each session should elect as commissioners to Presbytery, considering the size of the congregations and consistent with the principles of participation and representation found in F-1.0403 and G-3.0103, as follows:

- 1. The number of Ruling Elder Commissioners shall ordinarily equal the number of Active, Resident Teaching Elder members of the Presbytery.
- 2. "Active, Resident Teaching Elders" are Teaching Elder members who reside within the presbytery and participate in the life of the presbytery. Participation may be indicated in a variety of ways including but not limited to attending at least one stated meeting of the presbytery in the prior year; or serving in an appointed or elected position such as on a presbytery committee, sub-committee, commission, or task force; or participating in a presbytery support group; or in other service. Active Resident Teaching Elders may be currently serving in pastoral relationships with congregations, fellowships or 1001 New Worshipping Communities; they may be Honorably Retired; they may be serving in Validated Ministries or they may be Members-at-Large.
- 3. The number of Active, Resident Teaching Elders shall be ascertained as of January 1 of each year.
- 4. The number of Ruling Elder commissioners shall ordinarily be assigned as follows:
  - a. Each congregation, fellowship and worshipping community shall be entitled to two ruling elder commissioners.
  - b. Each Commissioned Ruling Elder shall be enrolled as member of the Presbytery during the period of the commission.
  - c. Each ruling elder officer of the presbytery shall be enrolled as a member of the presbytery during the period of service.
  - d. Each ruling elder chair of a standing presbytery committee shall be enrolled as a member of the presbytery during the period of service.
- 5. If necessary to achieve balance, additional ruling elder commissioners shall ordinarily be assigned to sessions in the following order:

- a. Each congregation with more than 100 members shall be assigned one additional commissioner.
- b. Each congregation with more than 300 members shall be assigned an additional commissioner.
- c. Each congregation with more than 500 members shall be assigned an additional commissioner.
- d. Each congregation with more than one Teaching Elder on staff shall be assigned an additional commissioner.
- In the selection or election of Ruling Elder Commissioners, the rich diversity of the Church's membership shall be considered, so that full participation and representation in the life of the Church and presbytery is honored.

# Reverend Dr. Barbara Anne Keely, Honorably Retired My ministries through and for the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area

Following graduation from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1987, I was ordained by Seattle Presbytery. I believe that with ordination, my membership is lodged in a Presbytery which is my primary community for ministry. And as I move to Honorably Retired, I thank the Committee on Ministry for inviting me to describe my involvement in the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area since 1991.

I was an active minister-member in the Presbytery of the James during the four years I was earning my doctorate from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (now part of Union Seminary) in Richmond, VA. In 1991, I transferred to this Presbytery and joined the faculty of United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities, where I taught and served in administration for 24 years. My primary position was Professor of Christian Education and Congregational Spirituality; in 2011, I was installed into the Schilling Chair of Religious Leadership and Church Administration, which including supervising UTS student church interns (4yrs). I also served as Director of Continuing Education (4yrs), and Director of the Master of Divinity Degree (6yrs).

In 2015, I left UTS and began a calling in transitional ministry. From 2015 – 2022, I served as a transitional pastor at Baldwin, St. Croix, Shakopee, and Maple Plain. Later in 2022, I served as part-time bridge pastor at Plymouth. I have been blessed to have several opportunities through the years to be a supply preacher and teach in our churches, and am delighted they continue into my retirement from full-time ministry.

My teaching at UTS included Christian education (children/youth/adult), spiritual life (individual and congregation), church leadership and administration, stewardship, and the senior integrative seminar. And I kept my courses grounded in the local church by always being there myself. I began at St. Luke Church, serving as the youth director (2 years), then taught courses and led events at Westminster (2yrs), and became parish associate at Presbyterian Church of the Way (7yrs). Bill Chadwick invited me to be his part-time co-pastor at the Wahkon and McGrath Churches, Northern Waters Presbytery (7yrs), and I was parish associate at Plymouth Church in 2012. The movement between the local church and classroom enriched my work in both contexts, but I had to step away from regular pastoral work when I became director of UTS' Contextual Studies, working with students in the churches where they were interning. As UTS is, by charter, an ecumenical seminary, I also worked with other denominations.

Another core course I taught yearly was "Presbyterian History, Worship and Polity", which included the Presbyterian candidates at Bethel, Luther, and UTS, as well as others who were interested. I chose to become Presbyterian when I was 20, partially because of PCUSA polity, and began teaching polity while in Richmond, VA. For almost 20 years, it was a privilege to gather students from the Twin Cities seminaries, always with different theological emphases and experiences, and invite them learn from each other what it is to be Presbyterian – and a pastor. At the request of the

Presbyteries of Minnesota Valleys' and Northern Waters' COM, I led directed studies for non-PCUSA clergy serving rural PCUSA churches. I also taught the polity course at General Assembly and Synod School. At the congregational level, I led Session trainings in several churches, as well as training events for PTCA and Minnesota Valleys. And I have been a confidential consultant for many who called through the years with polity and worship questions. (Yes, the RSV Bible translation did include the phrase "decently and in order".) I also read national ordination exams.

It seems I have always been on at least one Presbytery Committee, since Jan Noller recruited me for Christian Education the first month I was here. Through the years, I served 2 terms (often as chair) of Christian Education, Congregational Development, Bills and Overtures, Personnel and Board of Trustees (which I will complete in 2023). I also have served on at least 10 administrative commissions, some with joy and others with purpose and commitment. Working with Presbyterian colleagues in these various settings has given me deep appreciation for my clergy colleagues and ruling elders.

I regret I never served on CPM or COM, but other UTS Presbyterian faculty and I agreed to do so would be a boundary violation, as we knew and worked with students (and alums) as academic advisors and professors.

Other PTCA involvement included being a chaperone for PTCA youth at Triennium, a Commissioner to General Assembly (twice), and GA volunteer staff. I also chaired the Daily Worship Committee when General Assembly met in Minneapolis, and participated in clergywomen groups that used to meet regularly. I was on the planning committee for the Re-Imagining Conference and led a Synod Confirmation youth retreat at Clearwater Forest..

For over 25 years, I was active in the Association of Presbyterian Church Educators, and taught Christian educator certification courses at Princeton, PSCE, and Synod of Lakes and Prairies' Synod School for over 15 years. I also taught other courses at Synod School, primarily in nurturing the spiritual life of individuals and congregations. And I read certification exams for PCUSA Educator Certification.

I worked with the national Presbyterian Older Adult Ministries (POAM), developing its certification process, as well as teaching courses and speaking at national meetings.

I was a plenary speaker for a national PCUSA evangelism event Las Vegas (and like to point out that the only times I have visited Las Vegas, Reno and Atlantic City involved being part of Presbyterian gatherings). And I was blessed through the years to teach and preach in churches and at presbytery events around the country. I also spoke and taught at UCC, United Methodist, and United Church of Canada events.

I am grateful for this opportunity to describe the plethora of opportunities given me to serve PTCA and the PCUSA for over three decades. In retirement, I have returned to Westminster, and am participating in worship, adult education and other opportunities..

### Institutional Race and Equity Self-Assessment (IREA) Update:

Please plan to read the packet and attend the May 2023 presbytery meeting, where the self-assessment report will be shared for initial discussion. A few updates:

**Self-Assessment:** The working group celebrated the 3 year "anniversary" of the beginning of their work (Feb 2020) by finalizing the themes of their report at a winter retreat with our consultant, Jessica Vazquez Torres of Crossroads Antiracism Organizing and Training. These themes are theologically-based and will invite us to deeper curiosity, self-awareness, and growth in our congregations and shared presbytery spaces.

**Recommendations**: The self-assessment team will be offering several recommendations for future action for congregations and the PTCA as a whole to continue our transformation in response to the Holy Spirit in our work of creating greater equity in our communities of faith. Some of these recommendations will be quite pragmatic in nature, and some may require presbytery discussion and action. This will be an opportunity for the presbytery to reflect and choose a path forward in this transformational journey.

Resources for Congregations: The report release team is planning a summer meeting of congregational leaders for a cookout and conversation about engaging their congregation about the report. Featuring a Bible Study/ discussion group options, worship resources and more, the event will have opportunities to really think through specific questions and challenges with leaders from other congregations in similar situations, as well as members of the assessment team and Anna Kendig Flores, PTCA Anti-Racism Coordinator.
