MEETING MINUTES

The Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area met for a Stated Meeting on Tuesday, May 5, 2026, 4:00 p.m. at Buffalo Presbyterian Church, Buffalo, Minnesota, and over Zoom videoconferencing. The meeting packet, including all written reports, is available as **Exhibit A**.

Moderator Paul Moore, TE, called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m. and offered an opening prayer.

Moore welcomed presbyters and guests to the meeting, reminding those present in person to always use a microphone when speaking. Moore introduced some of the many individuals assisting with today's meeting including MAZE Team members Chaz Nove and Myron Jones, Office Administrator and Zoom co-host Jennifer Schultz, and Zoom co-host Ben Masters. Moore reminded all present to use the color paddles when seeking recognition to speak. The different colors will indicate to the Moderator how you wish to participate in discussion (Green = in favor; Red = against; Yellow = Question/Clarification needed; Blue = Process (i.e. substitute motion, call the question, etc.)

Moore invited TE Ben Masters, Zoom co-host, to speak to the Zoom participants on how to fully participate in today's meeting. Masters instructed Zoom presbyters to use the rename and raise hand features of Zoom, as appropriate.

Moore invited the MAZE team, Nove and Jones, to offer technical instructions for engaging in our new technology.

Moore invited TE Brain Entz, pastor of Buffalo Presbyterian Church to give words of welcome. Entz spoke of Buffalo Presbyterian Church's 170-year history and expressed gratitude for the many church volunteers working to provide hospitality and support to the Presbytery as it gathers here today. Entz also read the Presbytery's Land Acknowledgement statement:

"The churches of the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area lie on the traditional homeland of the Dakota people, as well as on Ojibwe lands, and we acknowledge the Dakota and Ojibwe peoples as the traditional stewards of the lands and waters on which we live. The treaties that ceded these lands to US and private control were fundamentally unjust in both nature and outcome. We in the PTCA are called to repair our relationship with indigenous people not just through words, but through our actions for listening, truth-telling, solidarity, repentance, and restorative giving."

Moore invited Stated Clerk John Curtiss, TE, to advise the Presbytery regarding the formation of the roll. Curtiss stated that the roll is formed when each presbyter registers attendance by either signing the attendance sheet (in person) or joining the zoom meeting (Zoom). Clerk Curtiss advised the Moderator that a quorum was present.

Moderator Moore declared that a quorum was present.

Moderator Moore invited all new Teaching Elders to be introduced. Pastor Kyle Sandison, Valley Community, Golden Valley was introduced. Moderator Moore then asked that any Ruling Elder commissioners attending their first Presbytery meeting be introduced. First time commissioners from Edgumbe, Valley Community, and Central were introduced.

Moderator Moore asked if there were any corresponding members who desired to be seated today. Linda Sharpe, Relations Manager, Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program and Teaching Elder Josh Erikson, Presbytery of Chicago, were introduced and Moore declared that they are seating as corresponding members with voice for tonight's meeting.

Moderator Moore announced that the first order of business is to approve the Docket, which includes the OMNIBUS Motion/Consent Agenda and the minutes of the February 7, 2026, Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area. The Docket, including the OMNIBUS Motion/Consent Agenda and minutes from the last meeting are found in **Exhibit A, page 2**.

Moderator Moore asked if anyone wished to request a change to the docket. It was requested by TE Alexandra Jacobs to switch the *Report: Acting Co-Executive Presbyters* with the *Report: Committee on the Preparation for Ministry*. This request was granted.

Moderator Moore asked if anyone wanted to pull any item of business from the OMNIBUS/Consent Agenda. There were none.

It was **MSC** to approve the Docket, as amended.

Moderator Moore invited TE Anna Kendig Flores and TE Zach Wilson, Acting Co-Executive Presbyters to give a report. Wilson and Kendig Flores reported on participating in recent Presbytery events, including helping coordinate responses to the recent *Operation Metro Surge* and their experience at denominational *Presbytery Leader Formation* event.

Moderator Moore thanked Zach and Anna for their report.

Moderator Moore invited Pastor Scott Jones and TE Alexandra Jacobs to give a report on behalf of the Committee for the Preparation of Ministry. Jones reported that the CPM continues to update its policies and procedures, especially regarding the process of interested ruling elders seeking to become Commissioned Ruling Elders. Jones and Jacobs introduced Alex Boltz. Alex has recently been enrolled as an Inquirer. Alex is a member of Westminster, Minneapolis, is serving as an intern in children's ministry at House of Hope, Saint Paul this summer, and is planning on attending Princeton Theological Seminary in the fall.

Moderator Moore declared this report to be received.

Moderator Moore announced that the Presbytery will now enter into a time of worship, led by members of the Buffalo Presbyterian Church choir, members of the Pastoral Leader Care Team, and by Pastor Josh Erikson, founder of the Presbyterian Church Growth Network. Erikson preached a sermon based on Acts 16:1-5 and reminded us that the church is called to be faithful in following Christ. Members of the Pastoral Leader Care Time led the Presbytery in a time of reflection on how the impact of the recent Operation Metro Surge continues to be felt.

Following worship, Erikson gave a keynote presentation, highlighting the work of the Presbyterian Growth Network's first year and challenging all churches to grow in ways that are faithful, healthy, and sustainable. There were "table-top conversation starters" inspired by this work available at the dinner tables.

Before the Presbytery paused for an evening meal, RE Elsa Kendig reminded us of the Mexican struggle for independence, honored on this day (May 5, *Cinco de Mayo*).

Moore prayed for the meal and dismissed the Presbytery to the fellowship hall.

At 6:30 pm, Moderator Moore called the Presbytery back to order and invited presbyters to come forward and share *community time* announcements.

Moderator Moore invited RE Sue Rutford, a member of the Clearwater Forest Board of Directors to share an announcement about Clearwater's upcoming summer schedule. During the report, a video was shown, introducing the ongoing capital campaign (Fan the F.L.A.M.E.) at Clearwater to raise money to build a new building on camp. Rutford also highlighted the joy and anticipation of a full summer camp schedule.

Moderator Moore invited TE Chris Chatelaine-Samsen, Commission on Ministry chair to come forward to give their report. The COM written report can be found on **page 8 of Exhibit A**. Chatelaine-Samsen highlighted the changes to the 2027 Terms of Call form, reminded pastors and Clerk's of Session to submit current Terms of Call for COM review, and announced that the grant to offset the cost of increased Board of Pensions dues is still available.

Chatelaine-Samsen announced that the congregation at House of Hope, St Paul desired to extend a call as Associate Pastor to their current Transitional Associate Pastor. It was reported that the COM had met with church leadership and that COM concurred with this path forward. It was noted that although this is an exception, it is possible by a $\frac{3}{4}$ vote on the floor of Presbytery.

It was ***moved*** to authorize the congregation of House of Hope, St. Paul, to extend a call to the current Transitional Associate Pastor as Associate Pastor. Since this motion comes from a commission, there is no need for a second.

Moderator Moore asked if there was any discussion. There was none.

Moderator Moore asked if the body was ready to vote.

Moderator Moore asked that the following Zoom poll be published: "Shall the Presbytery authorize the congregation of House of Hope, Saint Paul, to extend a call to the current Transitional Pastor as Associate Pastor (yes, no, abstain)?" and instructed the poll be published.

Moderator Moore asked the presbyters in the room to vote.

The ***Motion Carried***. The results of the Zoom poll were: 35 Yes, 1 No, 1 Abstain.

Chatelaine-Samsen continued with the COM report and introduced Pastor Pornchai (Paul) Banchasawan, pastor elect of Community, Rochester and Community, Plainview. Banchasawan introduced himself and shared his calling to ministry in general, and his calling to serve the two Community Presbyterian Churches in Rochester and in Plainview.

It was ***moved*** that the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area receive Pastor Pornchai (Paul) Banchasawan into membership of the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area. No second was required.

Moderator Moore asked if there was any discussion. There was none.

Moderator Moore asked that the following Zoom poll be published: "Shall the Presbytery receive Pastor Pornchai (Paul) Banchasawan into membership of the Twin Cities Area (Yes, No, Abstain)?"

The ***Motion Carried***. The results of the Zoom poll were 35 Yes, 0 No, 1 Abstain.

Moderator Moore declared that the Commission on Ministry report was received.

Moderator Moore invited Linda Sharp, Relationship Manager from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program, to come forward as a ministry partner. Sharp shared the many ways in which PILP serves the church and offers ways for churches and individuals to invest resources as well as have access to competitive loan rates. Moderator Moore thanked Sharp for attending the meeting tonight.

Moderator Moore invited TE Jeff Foels, member of the Nominating and Developing Leaders Committee, to give their report.

The NDL report is found on **page 8 Exhibit A**.

It was ***moved*** to elect TE Steven Tyykila to the Pastoral Positions Team, November 2028.

Since this motion comes from a committee, it does not require a second.

Moderator Moore asked that the following Zoom poll be published: "Shall the Presbytery elect TE Steven Tyykila to the Pastoral Positions Team (November 2028), (Yes, No, Abstain)?"

The ***Motion Carried***. The results of the Zoom poll were 36 Yes, 0 No, 1 Abstain.

Moderator Moore declared the NDL report received.

Moderator Moore invited RE Elsa Kendig, chair of the Presbytery Leadership Team, to give their report. Kendig shared the recent work of the PLT, including receiving and reviewing the Antiracism policy, developed in collaboration with the Race and Equity Report Implementation Team (RERIT) and the Antiracism Task Force (ARTF).

The PLT report is found on **page 8, Exhibit A**.

It was ***moved*** to approve the Antiracism policy.

Since this motion comes from a commission, it does not require a second.

Moderator Moore asked if there was any discussion. There was none.

Moderator Moore asked that the following Zoom poll be published: "Shall the Presbytery adopt the Antiracism Policy (Yes, No, Abstain)?"

The ***Motion Carried***. The results of the Zoom poll were 36 Yes, 0 No 1 Abstain.

Moderator Moore declared that the PLT report is received.

Moderator Moore asked TE John Curtiss, Stated Clerk, to give a report on attendance. The Stated Clerk report is found on **page 12 Exhibit A**. Curtiss reported the attendance numbers as

follows: TE 61 (38 on Zoom; 23 in person) and RE 40 (23 on Zoom; 17 in person) for a total of 101 in attendance.

Moderator Moore announced that this concluded the business planned for the meeting and declared that the Presbytery is adjourned. Moore offered a closing prayer.

MEETING MINUTES

The Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area met for a Called Meeting on Thursday, July 9, 2026, 7:00 p.m. over Zoom videoconferencing. The meeting packet, including the purchase agreement, appendix A and appendix B is available as **Exhibit A**.

Moderator Paul Moore, TE, called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm and opened with prayer.

Moderator Moore invited Stated Clerk John Curtiss to offer a brief orientation for a Zoom Presbytery meeting. Curtiss asked participants to use the rename feature to indicate if they are a RE or TE, list their church affiliation, and indicate their preferred pronouns. Curtiss asked that presbyters keep themselves on mute unless called upon by the moderator.

Moderator Moore asked Stated Clerk John Curtiss to advise the body regarding the forming of the rolls. Curtiss said that the roll is formed when each presbyter registers attendance and joins the meeting. Because our bylaw quorum requires 3 or more ruling elders and 3 or more teaching elders representing 3 different congregations, a quorum was advised.

Moderator Moore declared that a quorum is present.

Moderator Moore invited a member of the Board of Trustees to give their report and recommendation.

TE Margaret Fox, on behalf of the Board of Trustees made the following motion:

“The Board of Trustees recommends the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area approve the sale of the church property, New Life Presbyterian Church, 965 Larpenteur Avenue W, Roseville, MN 55113, as described in the purchase agreement, including Appendix A and Appendix B, for the purchase price of \$3,600,000.00”

Moderator Moore declared that because this motion comes from a commission (the Board of Trustees) it does not need a second. Moderator Moore asked if there was any discussion.

General questions were asked about the process of discerning the merger between New Life Presbyterian Church and the Falcon Heights United Church of Christ, the hopes of the ministry made possible with this merger, and the use of the proceeds. Representing the newly formed Garden Community Church Treasurer Jym Hubbel and Clerk of Session Fae Wilson spoke to this process.

Moderator Moore declared that the Presbytery was ready to vote.

The following Zoom poll was advanced:

“Shall the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area approve the sale of the church property, New Life Presbyterian Church, 965 Larpenteur Avenue W, Roseville, MN 55113, as described in the purchase agreement, including Appendix A and Appendix B, for the purchase price of \$3,600,000.00? (Yes, No, Abstain)”

Presbyters were given time to submit their vote through the Zoom poll.

Moderator Moore asked the Stated Clerk to report the results of the vote.

Stated Clerk Curtiss reported that the vote total was: 41 yes; 0 no; 2 abstain.

The motion *carries*.

Moderator Moore invited any who had further questions to remain on the zoom call after the closing prayer.

Moderator Moore announced that this concluded the business for tonight’s meeting.

Moderator Moore declared that we are adjourned and closed the meeting in prayer.

A handful of presbyters remained on the Zoom call to chat and ask/answer questions.
